

Short Study 044: The "I Am" Statements of Jesus 3 - The Good Shepherd

Study Author: Michael Button

Read John 10:1-11 and Psalm 23

Introduction: The aim of this study is to identify in what ways Jesus is "The Good Shepherd". It can be helpful to view the work of Jesus in the light of Psalm 23, and to refer to the Short Study on this Psalm, ref. 003. Below are some suggested scriptures which point to some activities of Jesus, or the result of His activities. Describe those activities or their results (the first one has been done for you).

There are actually two "I Am" statements of Jesus in John Chapter 10: "I am the door of the sheep" (verses 7-9) and "I am the good shepherd" (verse 11-14), but they are intrinsically linked, as we shall see.
